NEWS FROM WORLINGWORTH CEVC PRIMARY SCHOOL

New Year , New Lockdown!

After a very uncertain start to the new term and despite the delivery of last-minute news from the Government about the closure of schools due to the national lockdown, the delivery of our new whole school topic 'Distant Discoveries' and the teaching and learning of all our pupils has continued in a new and exciting form! We are currently providing daily live lessons for all pupils with their teachers via Zoom combined with online lessons set each day via our new online classes on Microsoft Teams or Tapestry. These new remote channels for delivering learning have not quelled the high expectations or enjoyment levels for all pupils which are set by the staff at our school. To date a variety of Zoom lessons have been delivered including practical Science lessons looking at the heart, Topic lessons digging and exploring archaeology and the Stone Age , English lessons on Shakespeare and Poetry , French conversations sessions and RE journeys into the beliefs and values of Hinduism.

We are enormously proud of how well our pupils and their families have quickly adapted to managing their new routines of learning, which when combined with work and other family commitments, can be very challenging at times. We have welcomed how as a school community we have come together and supported each other to ensure the safety of everyone and most importantly, ensured the continuity of learning and education for all - so thank you.

Supporting Online Access

One of our key priorities last month at the start of lockdown, was to immediately provide all our pupils with the right technology needed to access the Government's requirements for online learning. We are therefore extremely grateful to the Southolt Townlands Trust and the Worlingworth Charities for their generous donations to the school which enabled us to purchase several digital devices for some of our families most in need. In addition, we would like to say a special thank you to the local Worlingworth resident who kindly donated a lap top and ipad to the school which again were quickly assigned to some of our families. The feedback from pupils who received donations is very positive and it has enabled them to quickly and easily complete their online lessons along with their peers and to keep on learning.

Clopen School

Whilst many children are studying from home, the school continues to remain open for children of keyworkers and our vulnerable pupils. In addition, our Nursery is open each day providing excellent quality of care and learning for some of our youngest and newest school members.

Rainbow Values This term our new Rainbow Value is Co-operation and the children are exploring the importance of this value and how it is reflected in Christian beliefs and actions through their online lessons and also in our weekly assembly via Zoom. This value is proving to be particularly pertinent during this period of time where we are all very much working together and often value the encouragement of being part of a team.



Letter from David Burrell

Dear Friends, Candlemas Day - February 2

For the Romans and the Celts February was the start of spring, but it was not part of the original Roman calendar and along with January was inserted by a chap called Numa Pampilius when the calendar was extended from ten to twelve months. The word February comes from februa which means cleansing or purification and reflects the many rituals that took place before the start of spring.

The Anglo Saxons called February Sol-monath (cake month) because cakes were offered to the gods during the spring festival. In Shakespeare's time the second month of the year was called Fevrell and one hundred years later in the time of Isaac Newton it had become Februeer. The modern name which reflects more closely the original Roman name only came into use about one hundred years ago.

The 2nd February is celebrated in Church and is called Candlemas day. This ancient festival marks the midpoint of winter between the shortest day and the spring equinox. Candlemas marks the end of the Christmas season where we turn from the celebration of Christ's birth and make ready for his death and resurrection at Easter. Robert Herrick in his poem 'Ceremonies for Candlemas Eve,' writes:

Down with rosemary and bay,
Down with mistletoe;
Instead of holly, now up-raise
The greener box (for show)

On Candlemas day all the candles that were to be used in the church and at home in the coming year were brought to church and a blessing was said over them thus the festival day or mass for candles. And candles were very important not only because there was no electric or gas light but because they were thought to give protection against plague and illness and famine. For Christians they were a reminder of something even more important. Before Jesus came to earth, it was as if everyone was 'in the dark'. People often felt lost and lonely. With the Advent of Jesus with his message that God was with us and loved us so much he came down from heaven to live among us. Jesus became the guiding light to Christians and he was given the title 'Light of the World,' so we light candles to remind us of this. Candlemas is important in the Church year because not only does it remind us of the God of love who came to be with us but also the changing of the seasons. And as the season changes so does the mood of the Church, the Christmas joy is modified by the impending approach of Easter. Although Easter too is a great joyful celebration we must first pass through Holy Week and especially Good Friday the day when Jesus died on the cross. To be a Christian means we must be grounded in our faith and it needs to be real we shall be celebrating Candlemas on 31st Jan in Tannington Church and on zoom, do attend if you can.

Whilst there is no doubt that in fighting the old variant of the virus, our collective efforts were working, but we now face the added challenge of the new strain of the virus, which is between 50% and 70% more transmissible. This new strain has led to a rapid surge in infections, hospital admissions and increased case rates across the country, including here in Suffolk.

If we are to protect our NHS and in turn, ourselves and our loved ones, we must all play our part and follow the guidance so that our NHS can focus on the herculean task of delivering the critical vaccination programme. It is the vaccination that will finally free us from this virus and the restrictions it brings to all our daily lives

Vaccinations have already begun here in Suffolk and I have been lobbying Ministers and Public Health colleagues to ensure that we have adequate site provision here in Central Suffolk and North Ipswich. Our public health team and NHS colleagues here in Suffolk are working tirelessly to deliver the vaccines as quickly and efficiently as possible, to those most in need and I would echo their plea to ask residents not to block phone lines to GP surgeries or hospitals enquiring about when the vaccine might be available – residents will be contacted directly, in turn, and invited to attend their nearest site for vaccination.

Whilst I and indeed, our Prime Minister, understand just how frustrating this latest lockdown is, it is vital that we all continue to take the necessary precautions to protect ourselves and those most vulnerable in our communities and to slow the spread of the virus. Again, I would like to thank each and every one of you who are continuing to play your part and following the rules – we're all in this together and the sooner we stick with it, the sooner we can start to return to normal.

It is vital that throughout lockdown, we continue to protect jobs and our local economy, and the Chancellor has unveiled further financial support for businesses and individuals.
