Thank you to our fantastic volunteers – Thank you to everyone who helped make the **Autumn Tidy** such a success. It was refreshing to find that this year there was less general litter around the village and it is noted that many of you are keeping your own patches neat throughout the year, for which we thank you. Unfortunately, there was still a bit of litter that needed collecting, with this year's noticeable find being a whole duvet!

Thanks also to everyone who helped with the **Walking Day**, either on the day itself, or in the days leading up to the event. It is great to be able to have a snapshot of the state of our footpaths and fifteen actionable items have now been reported to Suffolk County Council. During the pandemic many more people have discovered the joys of the extensive footpath network that Worlingworth benefits from and it is important to look after such a valuable resource.

Unofficial Notices – At the last Parish Council meeting there was discussion about notices being pinned up for short periods of time advertising events in the village and surrounding areas. Please remember to remove any notices after the event, as these can add to littering problems if abandoned.

Anglian Water Sewerage Works- The Parish Council has been working closely with Anglian Water to address the flooding issues that have arisen in the village over the last couple of years. Remedial work has been carried out in Shop Street in front of Willow Tree Yard, with further work being planned on pipes that run across fields. It is good that this work is being carried out, but **YOU** can do your part too – please remember to only flush the '**3 P's**' down the toilet (PooPaperPee) anything else can combine to form the notorious 'fatbergs' and clog the system.

The Community Bus is a valuable service to enable villagers to travel to some of the bigger towns in our area. If you haven't tried it before then do have a look at our timetable on www.combus.org.uk and have a ride out! The Committee requests that passengers **WEAR A MASK FOR THEIR OWN SAFETY AND RESPECT TO OTHER PASSENGERS** and use antibacterial hand sanitiser. We would also advise passengers to keep some space between themselves where possible.

Dear Friends, Letter from David Burrell November 2021

We are coming up to a season of remembering.

Remembering is as tainted by our fallen human nature as any other activity. It's so easy only to remember that Germany provoked two world wars and spawned perhaps the most evil ideology that there has ever been. It's harder to remember that no German under the age of 90 can possibly be held responsible for World War II or Nazi doctrines, and should therefore not be pilloried or caricatured for evermore. We also need to remember that heroism and suffering were not confined to the Allies.

As well as remembering the fallen at our special services on Remembrance Sunday we also remember this month Guy Fawkes. We often forget that he and his fellow plotters were motivated by genuine grievances, but these were ignored because of what we should now call the terrorist plot to blow up the Houses of Parliament.

Modern plotters should most definitely 'remember, remember the Fifth of November'. The cause of Roman Catholic emancipation was set back for two centuries because of public outrage.

Many churches hold Requiems on All Souls Day, November 2nd, during which the names of the congregation's loved ones are read out. In this benefice we carry out this act of remembrance during Advent (details in next month's Magazine). But it is not only we who remember those whom we love but see no longer, or all those who fought for their country. God remembers. The writer of Psalm 88 might say pessimistically 'I am... like the slain that lie in the grave, like those whom you remember no more, for they are cut off from your hand'. He had no concept of life beyond death. The thief on the cross, on the other hand, begged Jesus to remember him. He was saying more than he knew. We believe that God remembers, holds in his mind and heart for good, all his human creation living and departed, until the day when our souls and bodies are reunited.

The favourite part of my week is undoubtedly returning home to Suffolk when Parliament concludes on a Thursday. The marked change of returning home to Suffolk with its wide-open skies and clean air is immediately rejuvenating after being in London. We are lucky to live in a county like Suffolk protected from overdevelopment and with our strong rural heritage.

Protecting Suffolk, the United Kingdom, and the rest of the world from climate change is the reason that world leaders are meeting in Glasgow for the United Nations Climate Change **Conference of the Parties** summit (COP26) in early November. At the conference, the UK and all the other countries attending will be expected to carry out a process known as the “ratchet mechanism”, whereby a greater commitment is made to reducing carbon emissions and prevent further global warming.

Climate change is one of the greatest challenges we face, and I am proud of Britain’s world-leading role in tackling climate change and the transition to Clean Energy Growth. The UK was the first country to pass laws to become carbon neutral and eliminate our contribution to climate change by 2050. We have been the second fastest country in the G20 to cut climate emissions. Suffolk’s Energy Coast is now playing an important role in the supply of the UK’s clean energy requirements and it’s anticipated that our area will produce some 30% of the UK’s energy requirements by 2030.

I recently met with the South Korean Vice Minister for Trade, Industry and Energy: Park Jin-kyu to discuss climate change. South Korea is a world leading economy in developing new technologies including new technologies that help to reduce carbon emissions. They are also passing laws to ensure that South Korea will be carbon neutral by 2050. If we are serious about meeting our own climate change commitments, we shall need to continue to exchange ideas and work with South Korea and other countries that are committed to the 2050 carbon neutral commitment at the forthcoming COP26 conference and in the years ahead.

The COP26 summit will also highlight the need for us all to play our own individual role in helping to reduce carbon emissions and slow down the rate of climate change. Whilst global Governments and industry are key players, tackling climate change is everyone’s responsibility and by making small and simple changes in our daily lives, we can collectively help to make a difference.

These small changes needn’t cost a lot of money, for example, switching to an energy supplier who uses renewable energy or switching to more energy efficient LED light-bulbs in our homes; or perhaps thinking about reducing our food miles and sourcing our food and produce more locally – we certainly have an abundance of excellent suppliers right here in Suffolk.
