Dear friends and neighbours

Times, they are a-changing *

In everything we see and experience, life changes and this is normal, but can be hard to cope with. It all depends on what else is going on. Everything else going on as normal allows us to cope with change, but when we throw into the mix the fatigue and stress caused by the pandemic, lockdowns, cost of living crisis, war in Ukraine and other parts of the world, as well as famines and natural disasters, it all begins to pile up and make it difficult to cope. For our benefice too we have to add in the effects of being in an interregnum (the time without a paid priest mainly focused on our benefice). For some they fear that this means we are without a leader or guide. Fortunately, this is not the case, as we have other leaders within our church who oversee the benefice during this time. For the Four Rivers, this is our Rural Dean, Revd Canon Susan Loxton. She will help to provide stability and leadership throughout the interregnum, supporting our SSMs and lay people, including our reader and elders.

It is during times such as this that we can appreciate the stability brought within our parishes by those who perform unsung tasks within our communities; those who get on with their job, often with little thanks and who need our support, help and prayers.

We have a year in which we can support another type of service and stability. In celebrating the Queen's Platinum Jubilee throughout 2022, we have the opportunity to reflect on the stability of her reign and the many changes that have happened during this period.

Whether your main celebrations took place back in June, or whether they are still continuing with a plan to plant your contribution to the Green Canopy later in the autumn, stop for a moment to reflect on all the changes that you, the nation and the Queen have come through.

For Christians there is also an important leader that I have not yet mentioned, but who is the most important of all. This is the one who has created and continues to sustain us throughout all the changes and transformations that we experience. We can rely on the presence of God and in our knowledge of him through getting to know Jesus better each day. This is what led the hymn writer to say,

O thou who changes not, abide with me.**

Remember that you are loved and supported by God in all the change you experience and can always turn to him, for he will help you to find peace and stability.

On the front playground we are removing the old, damaged benches and have plans to fit an exciting new piece of play equipment next year to replace them. Our new school logo will officially launch in September. We will be fitting new, improved signs outside the school, to replace the rusty, faded ones and to reflect this change in logo.

The Funeral of Lambert Abbott

The Funeral of Lambert Abbott took place at St. Peter's Church Monk Soham on Monday 30th May led by the Revd. Rebecca Artiss, with the Tribute / Eulogy read by his great niece Laura.

Lambert was born at the Royal Oak, Monk Soham in 1938 to parents Lambert and Molly. His sister Peggy attended the funeral, and he was brother to the late George. Lambert was a quiet man with few words. He went to Worlingworth school. He left there at 15 and worked with his father on the land and later in the pub.

The pub closed in 1970. Lambert bought the house and land where he had pigs, cattle and chickens. When his mother became ill, he looked after her for 12 years.

In between this he worked on 'Longs' Farm at Kenton.

When he retired, he spent many hours potting and chatting to his friend George. His neighbour Della used to make sure he was ok and made him cakes, and was an expected visitor when there was a thunder storm as they frightened her. She felt safe sheltering with Lambert. As he became less mobile he never complained about not being able to do what he used to do, as long as he had relations or friends to visit him, he was happy, he loved seeing children and always had a box of chocolates ready for them. They loved to play cards with him, but the favourite game was pressing the remote on his electric chair. Lambert would go up and down like a yoyo.

Unfortunately, in 2019 he had to go into care and in the last few months he had been in and out of hospital several times and passed away on the 20th May 2022 Lambert, was a determined, quiet and kind man, who knew his own mind, he was the epitome of the Monk Soham countryman and will be missed.
