The whole school have been learning about why the Queen's platinum jubilee is such a rare occasion and how they are part of this historic event. We have learnt about the Queen's family, King George's coronation, her early life and where she lives and has lived. We have taken a look back in time to her ancestors and linked previous topics related to Victorian England.



Class 1 have drawn their own monarchs and have re-enacted the Queen's coronation using crowns they made.
