May 2023 letter from Revd Enid

This month there is a lot of Kingdom talk. Firstly of course we have the coronation of King Charles III which many people are excited about. Secondly though, on the 28th of May we have the great celebration of the Kingdom of God called Pentecost. Pentecost, the celebration of the day the Holy Spirit was sent to be with us. The Holy Spirit who brought the people of God alive with hope, who brought new ability and possibility to the people of God in the early church. He came not with a whisper but a roar of power and led them from a fearful and broken place into new life. As a consequence of Pentecost, 3000 people came to faith in one day in one very small place. That Pentecost experience has been repeated again and again across the world with millions of people believing. It has happened several times already in Britain, what if it were to happen here? We in the northern hemisphere are at the very time in our year, in the cycle of seasons, when we are seeing new life busting out all over! Consequently, it perhaps makes it easier for us not just to celebrate the Holy Spirit acting in the past, but to exuberantly celebrate bursting in upon us again and breathing new life and vigour into us as God's holy Kingdom people.

When we struggle, when we feel tired, when we wonder if we can achieve what needs to be done (or truthfully perhaps before we are reduced to this level!), we need to call upon the Holy Spirit and ask to be filled again and refreshed with his life-giving power. Our God loves us and wants us to do well, wants us to succeed and wants us to proclaim his eternal Kingdom in all the world. God bless, *Reverend Enid*

Staging Available for All Village Organisations to Use

WORLINGWORTH CEVC PRIMARY: OUR MONTHLY NEWS

Whole School Topic We have a wonderful new topic this term called 'Up, Up and Away!'. This topic will focus on two of our curriculum cogs – communication and creativity. Each class will be studying this topic in different ways. Elgar Class will begin by weaving into their learning finding out about vehicles that fly; Vivaldi Class will learn about the history of flight; Britten Class are becoming historians studying the arrival of the American Airforce to Suffolk during WW2, whilst our oldest pupils in Chopin Class, will be learning about the reasons for and the events of the Battle of Britain and the significant impact it had on changing the course of events. This is a wide-reaching and engaging topic that will allow the children to be curious, to ask and seek answers to their many questions and to understand how both the power of creativity and communication resulted in our world becoming full of aviation success and challenges during the last 150 years. In June, to enrich their learning all the children will be flying off to visit the Duxford Air Museum – what an exciting adventure!

Willows Nursery Open Morning Our full-time nursery is a hive of activity and learning. It is a happy, caring place full of busy and confident learners. This month we are holding a special Open Morning on 17th May from 10-11.30am to invite new parents to come and visit our Early Years class, meet the team and see the curriculum in action. Summer Sports The Summer term always provides the opportunity to get more active and learn new sports and physical skills. This month we have an exciting whole school day learning the skills of Bollywood dancing with a specialist teacher and our Year 5 and 6s will be completing their Bikeability training. We will also be thinking about how we can use our bikes, feet and scooters more to get about and leave the car behind as part of Walk to School week in May.

Collective Worship This term our Rainbow Value is Friendship. The children will be exploring the concept of friendships in Collective Worship, how to be a good friend and why friendship is so important as a citizen of our world. We shall learn and reflect on the teaching of friendship in the bible and how Christians demonstrate friendships to others as part of their faith and learn some new hymns to celebrate our friendship together a community. Coronation Celebrations To celebrate the King's Coronation, we are holding a special Coronation afternoon this month. The children will come to school dressed in red, white and blue and we will be making crowns and singing our special Coronation song at the start of Collective Worship. An exhibition of portraits of King Charles by the children will be displayed at the Community Centre during the Coronation weekend. Do pop along and admire their artistic skills!

Year 6s For our hardworking year 6s this will be their final term at primary school and as well as continuing to complete their primary curriculum learning and try their best in their SATs this month, they will begin to focus on their transition to High School. Part of this transition is to plan their project to raise funds towards their special Year 6 hoodies. This fun but important project encourages them to problem solve, work together as a team, write publicity and explain their ideas to others as well as setting a budget and managing costs and income. It links well to our cogs of creativity and communication. We wish them lots of success this term in all they do and look forward to participating in their fundraising event.
